

LEAP's Guide to Reading Graphic Novels





Text structure is in panels, which look like a comic book.

Blend printed text with pictures to tell a story.

Read left to right as usual, but also notice panels can run up and down. Graphic novels also use different fonts, punctuation, italic letters, and capital (uppercase) letters to help readers understand the story.



Comprehension Tips



Prior knowledge: Think about what you already know about the topic and connect it to your reading. Making inferences: Combining prior knowledge and text information to draw a conclusion that isn't explicitly stated in text. Use context clues and your background knowledge to infer, or make a logical guess about the author's meaning.

Toggle/go back and forth between words and pictures to make sense of the text. You have to use all the information the author gives you.




Helpful Information
