## LEAP's Guide to Reading Informational Texts



Informational texts teach facts about every topic! Whether you like animals, engines, or cooking, you can find an informational text that will help you learn something new. Informational texts include text features to help you understand the topic. You may see a table of contents, a glossary, headings, captions, bold and/or italic print, graphs, photographs, or diagrams.

### Comprehension Tips

Informational texts often include educational photos, illustrations, and/or diagrams. Use these images to help you learn even more about the topic. Scan the text: Scan the table of contents to jump to the section or subtopic that you may be interested in. For example, if you're researching where giraffes live, jump to "Habitats."

#### Helpful Information

While most informational books will contain a table of contents, headers, and a glossary, they may not always include captions, diagrams, or graphs regularly. Use the text features that are provided as you read to help you understand the book.
